



Biography Greg Mammana

Greg started his career in law enforcement in 1994 with the Casa Grande (AZ) Police Department. He returned to his hometown of Tucson in 1998 when he was hired by the Tucson Police Department (TPD), where he spent the early part of his career working as a patrol officer and patrol supervisor.

Greg was promoted to the rank of Lieutenant in 2010. He was assigned to the Tucson Office of Emergency Management and Homeland Security as the Emergency Management Section Commander from 2011 to 2015, and is currently the commander of the Tucson Real-time Analytical Crime Center and the Homeland Security Intelligence Unit.

Greg graduated from the University of Arizona with a Bachelor of Arts in Political Science (1992), a Master of Arts in Organizational Management from the University of Phoenix (2003), and a Master of Arts in Security Studies through the Naval Postgraduate School's Center for Homeland Defense and Security (2015). Greg was elected to the National Homeland Security Association Board in 2012 and previously held the position of Vice President of Programming.
